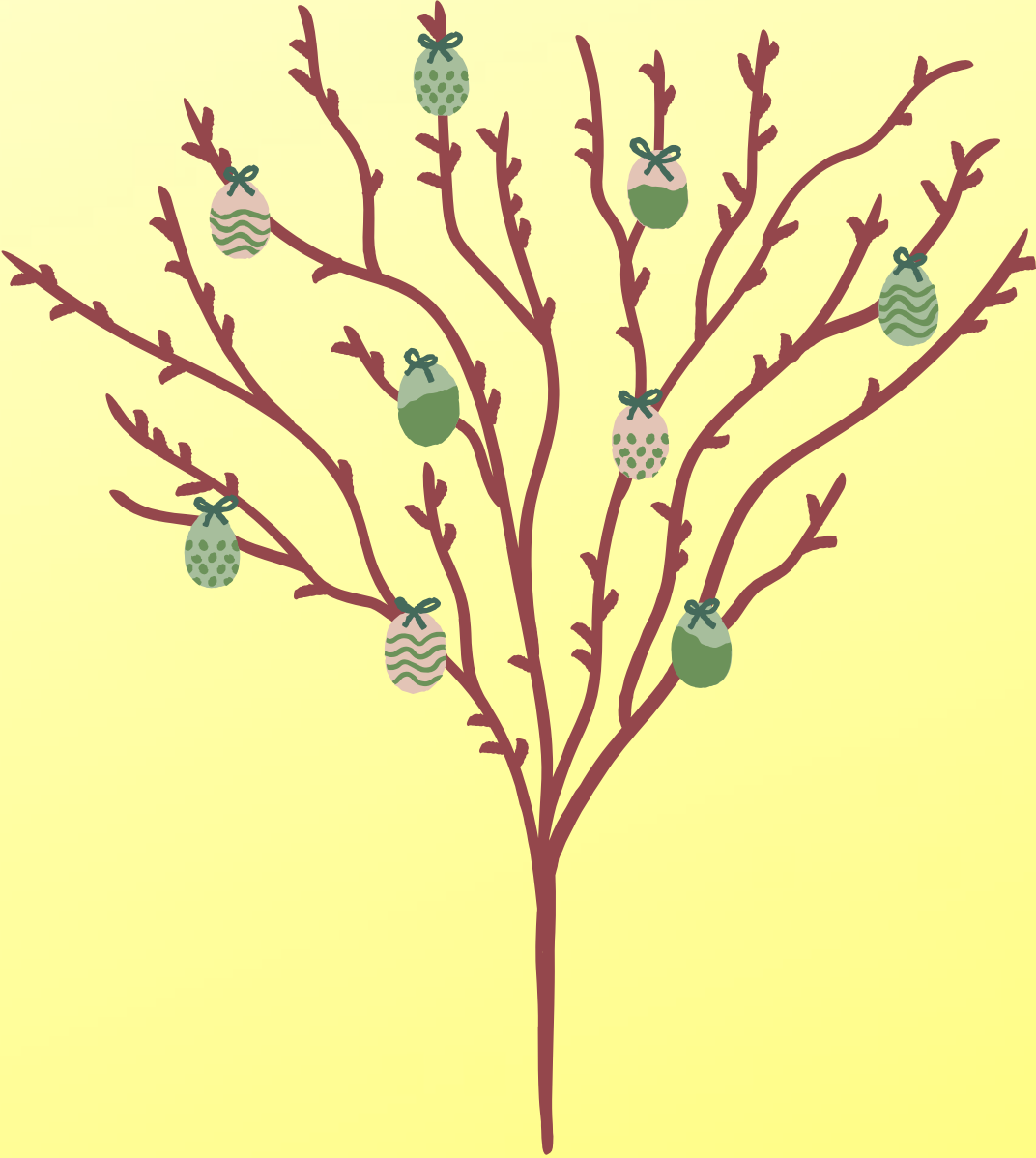
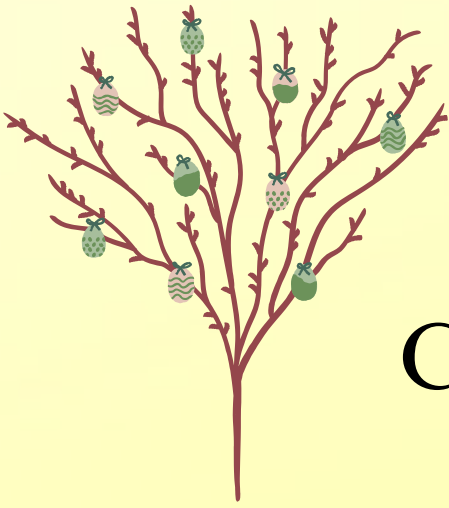

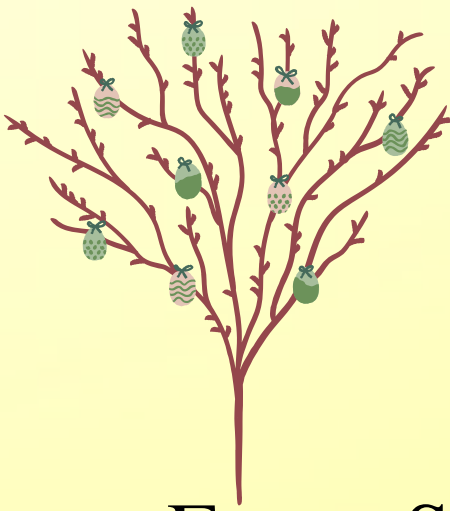


Curriculum News

Horticulture

This term, Students across school have been busy sowing seeds in preparation for our entry into the Lincolnshire Agricultural Society schools challenge. The aim of the challenge is to get growing, either through allotment, sensory gardens or wildlife gardening, evoking the senses through the types of plant we grow to boost mood and calm the mind.

During Forest School sessions this term the students have been learning about the life cycle of frogs, along with identifying the first signs of Spring. Saturn

Saturn students have had a great opportunity to learn about the past this term. The first half-term's topic was 'Long Ago' where we compared past and present and looked into family histories. We compared traditions, toys, clothes and music in past and present. Our favourite part was baking an old-fashioned cake which tasted delicious. The second half term's topic has been Dangerous Dinosaurs where we have found out about prehistoric times and studied dinosaurs. How surprised we were when we came back from February half term and noticed we have a prehistoric safari park in our area! It has been a great adventure to dig out fossils, count dinosaur spikes and do cave painting. Our favourite lesson was about volcanoes and making one erupt. We have practised phonics sounds and worked hard to communicate using words, Makaton and communication board. We have had an interactive white board fitted in the classroom so mark making has become a new experience. There have been lots of singing, dancing and playing instruments. In maths we have practised counting, compared size, length and height. We have learned time and studied different shapes. We have practised how to cross the road safely, learned about our feelings and explored jobs people do. It has been an interesting productive term.

Mars

This Spring Term, Mars Class have been very busy working on our literacy topic 'Cave Baby'. We have been creating expanded noun phrases to describe the animals and human characters, creating simple sentences using colourful semantics and extended sentences using 'and' as our conjunction. We have drawn cave paintings using our hands and our feet; built a mind map for a 'sorry' letter and retold the story as a class by sequencing pictures. We have individually produced a story map and completed a big write retelling the story from pictures focusing on the beginning, middle and end. In Maths we have been learning Multiplication and had great fun using practical activities, rhymes and our new interactive TV to learn our 2's, 5's and 10's. We have enjoyed looking at height and measure using objects, measuring in centimetres and using ourselves to learn tall, taller and tallest and small, smaller and smallest.

Our topic of Dangerous Dinosaurs; Puddles and Rainbows – took us on a great day out at Yorkshire Wildlife Park, despite the rain we enjoyed the animals and dinosaurs we saw and the inside dinosaur soft play centre. We have learnt about herbivores and carnivores, dinosaur footprints and how to make a rain cloud. We have built erupting volcanoes, freed frozen dinosaurs and had endless fun with messy craft activities.

We also had fun in Forest School making water chutes, digging in horticulture and learning to play instruments in music. We have celebrated World Book Day and Comic Relief Day.

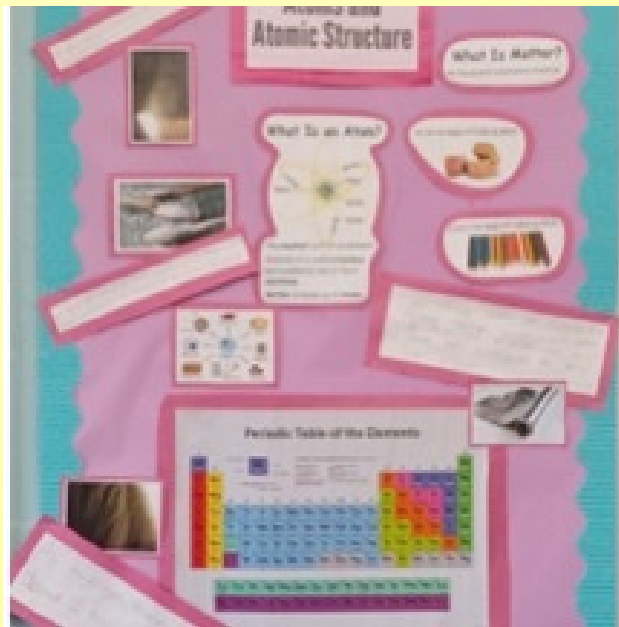


Moon

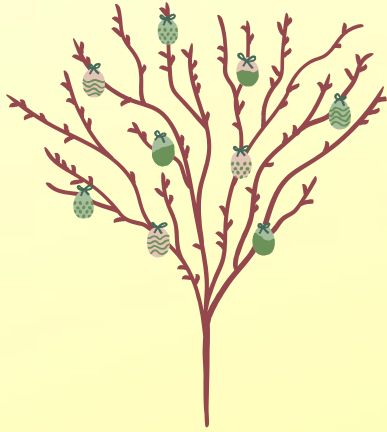


In Science we studied matter, and the smallest particle of matter, which is an atom. We studied elements and where they fit into the Periodic Table of Elements which they really enjoyed.

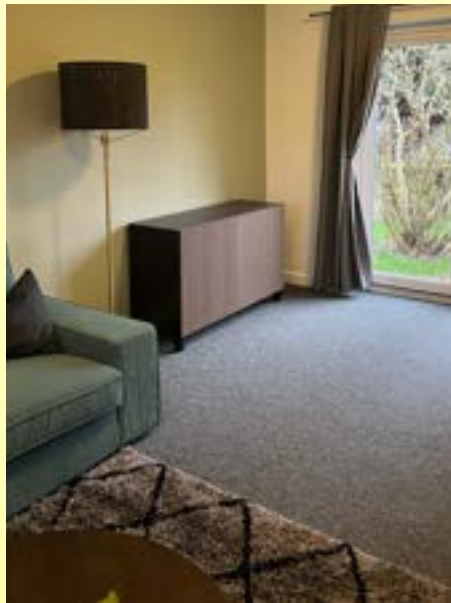


Jupiter

Mercury

It was a busy term for the children in Mercury. Our topic was “Dangerous Dinosaurs” which took us on an amazing journey to discover the incredible world of these giant creatures. We did a lot of counting, sorting, matching, and measuring. Using dinosaur toys, we introduced the children to questions such as “How many dinosaurs?”, “How many are there altogether?”, “How tall is that dinosaur?”, etc. We also learned some new concepts such as tall, taller, small, smaller and we counted all the way from 1 to 10.

Messy play and story time were the most exciting activities for the children, using paint, bubbles, soil, sand, and other different sensory materials. We encouraged them to embrace their creativity to express, explore and experience the different feelings of these textures. It was great to see the children playing, sharing, and taking turns in activities that were especially designed for them.

Story time this term has also been a great success! It was a delight to witness the children’s eagerness to participate. They took an active role in selecting the books and helping to set the room for story time every day. As a group we read some fantastic books this term including class favorites ‘Cave baby’ and ‘Super Worm’. Spending this time reading together each day was a brilliant way for them to work on their attention, understanding, listening and communication skills.

This term in the personal development area, we have encouraged the children to use their manners and say thank you, please and excuse me when appropriate. It has been gratifying to see some of the children starting to say “excuse me” after finishing their lunch and also helping to clean the table. Due to regular support from staff the children have even started to clean their teeth after eating as part of their routine.

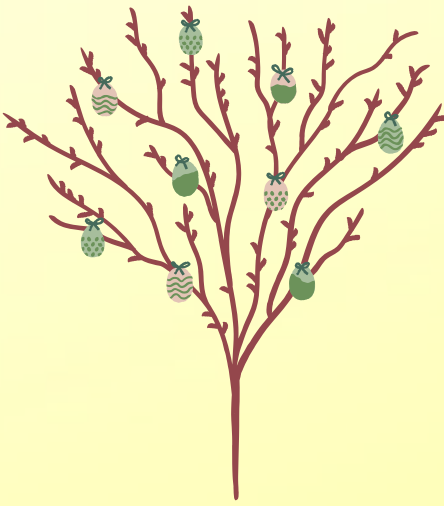
